The bill entitled, an act relating to the transfer of stock, was taken up for consideration, and referred to the consideration of the next

General Assembly.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the Chancellor and the several county courts of this State, to order and decree the sales of the real estate of minors in the cases therein mentioned, was read the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates

The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act relating to the people of color in this State, passed at December session 1831, chapter 281, so far as the same relates to Baltimore county, was read the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr Ricaud from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to prevent the destruction of wild fowl in the head waters of the Chesapeake bay, in the several counties therein mentioned, passed at December session 1837,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Ricaud.

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following

resolutions.

A resolution in favor of Melinda Shireliff,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

revolutionary claims.

A resolution requiring the Treasurer to pay the postage on all printed documents furnished the members of the Legislature after the adjournment,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

finance.

Also, delivered a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on in-

ternal improvement.

Mr. Cottman from the committee on the library to which was referred the resolution relative to Bozman's and McMahon's History of Maryland, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented

to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Purnell from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution requiring the Treasurer of the Western Shore to pay the postage on all public documents furnished the members of the legislature after the adjournment, reported favorably thereon.
