They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the petition of Derden Graves, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Derden Graves, a free negro of Kent county,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

Read the third time by special order and rejected.

Mr. Lee from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Baltimore county to examine into the complaints of Joseph Addison, a colored man residing in said county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Lee from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the commissioners of the tax of Carroll county, to fence in a garden at the jail of said county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

At the end of the bill add:

"Provided, that the expense thereof shall not exceed fifty dollars "

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Melinda Shireliff, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on pensions, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:
