On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The bill entitled, an act to secure to citizens of Allegany county, the right of trial for debt under warrant, in the election district only in which the party so sued may reside, was reconsidered, amended by striking out the 2nd section, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government of this State, was read, when

Mr. Ricaud offered the following amendment,

Which was read and dissented from:

Add the following section:

And be it enacted, That no judge, chancellor or register of wills, shall administer on the personal estate of any deceased person, unless appointed executor by last will and testament, or entitled to the same by due course of law; nor shall any judge, chancellor or register, be appointed trustee to make sale of any real estate sold by a decree of the court of which he may be a judge, chancellor or register.

The bill was then rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a weigh-master of live stock in the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The following amendment was read and dissented from;

At the end of the bill add:

Provided, that nothing contained in this act, shall prevent any owner or owners of any cattle, hogs or live stock, from disposing or selling the same without having them weighed under the provisions of this act, provided he or they may think proper and expedient so to do.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The following section was added to the bill,

And be it enacted, That the money to be expended under the provisions of this act, shall not exceed five thousand dollars.

On motion of Mr. Hambleton,

The bill was then read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

The resolution in favor of the committee clerks, was read the third time by special order, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.
