the bill entitled, an act for the better regulation of the Banking Institutions in this State, reported that the committee were of opinion the bill ought to pass with the amendments proposed by the committee of conference, and assented to by the house of delegates.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house or delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Print Company, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the weighing of anthracite or hard coal, and for the measuring of bituminous coal in the State of Maryland, and to repeal an act of Assembly heretofore passed in relation to that subject, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting Hay and Straw brought for sale to the city of Baltimore, and to repeal an act passed at December session 1837, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate, March 29, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

When we sent to your honorable body the message declining to accede to the proposition to prolong the session of the Legislature, it was under the hope that the business of the session might be closed to-night; but understanding that it will be impossible to do so, we propose with the consent of your honorable body to prolong the session until to-morrow, the 30th inst, and that the Governor be invited to attend in the Senate Chamber at 12 o'clock, M. for the purpose of signing the laws.

It was ordered, that when the Senate adjourns, it shall adjourn until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
