

The bill entitled, an act to confirm a certain deed therein mentioned, and

The bill entitled, an act in relation to a road authorised to be opened by an act passed at December session 1832, chapter 158, and its supplements.

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the better regulation of Chancery proceedings, in certain cases, passed at December session 1820, chapter 161, endorsed "will not pass."

On motion of Mr. Lee,

Leave was granted by special order, to Messrs. Lee, Jones and Kent, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act relating to the Frederick County Bank.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise George Morton of Prince George's county, guardian of George W. Morton and Harriet Morton, to consent to the reference of certain controversies between his wards and a certain John S. Skinner, and to declare the award of such reference to be binding on such wards, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Lee from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act in relation to the Frederick County Bank,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Lee,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on finance, submitted the following message; which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

The Senate observe that in the journal of accounts, George G. Brewer and Eli Duvall, are allowed one hundred dollars each, as "extra allowance." As this credit seems to be an unusual one, the Senate respectfully ask for such information in relation thereto, as will enable them to decide upon the propriety of allowing the same. If it be the wish of your honorable body to allow to your chief and assistant clerks the usual extra allowance, the Senate will have no objection to concur, provided that an equal amount is also allowed to the chief and assistant clerks of the Senate, which is also usual,—
