to this body. It was not intended as extra compensation for their services as clerks—this having been refused by your honorable body, we could not desire to obtain by indirection what we had failed in procuring by the ordinary mode of legislation. We are of opinion that each tranch of the legislature has the control of its own Hall, and of every thing appertaining thereto, and we think this house constitutionally competent to authorise an expenditure, looking only to their preservation.
