The bill entitled, an act to divorce William Harris, of Talbot county, from his wife Elizabeth L. Harris, was read the third time by special order and passed.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, ten o'clock.

THURSDAY, January 11, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce William Harris of Talbot county, from his wife Elizabeth L. Harris, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was sent to the house of delegates.
