A bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary Ann Bayly of Dorchester county, from her husband Josiah Bayly, Jr.

A bill entitled, an act entitled, a supplement to an act to incorporate the citizens of Taneytown in Carroll county, passed December session 1836, chapter 309,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations and joint stock companies.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed December session 1835, chapter 201,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the clerk of Worcester county court to record a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings

A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act to incorporate the Georges Creek Mining Company,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for electing commissioners for Allegany county, and prescribing their powers and duties,, passed at December session 1829. chapter 25,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Tidball, Bowie and Ricaud.

Mr. Bowie presented the petition of C. Farquhar, Henry Harding and others, citizens of Montgomery county, praying for the erection of a bridge over the Patuxent river,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Kent and Beckett.
