A bill entitled, an act to divorce Elijah Brittingham of Worcester county, from his wife Julian Brittingham,

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary Corner of Dorchester county, from her husband Solomon Corner, and

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Lydia Moore of the city of Baltimore, from her husband John Moore,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the com-

A bill entitled, an act to define the duties of Sheriffs, Coroners, and Elisors, so far as relates to Baltimore county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Ricaud and Cottman.

A bill entitled, an act entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the State of Maryland,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of St. Mary's county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Ricaud, Kent and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise William Penn, to bring into this state a negro slave for life, and

A bill entitled, an act to authorise John Milburn, to bring into this state a negro slave for life,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on colored population.

Mr. Bowie from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Port Deposite Rail Road Company, passed at December session 1831, chapter 288, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the petition of Thomas Brown, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Brown, an insolvent debtor,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Read the third time by special order and passed.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.
