

MONDAY, January 15, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Brown, an insolvent debtor, passed by the Senate on Saturday, was sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relating to the election of Directors in the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and to the deposite of the funds of said company,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Also delivered a bill entitled, an act to divorce George W. Maxwell of Prince George's county, from his wife Mary Maxwell,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Springfield academy, in Carroll county, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise John Milburn, to bring into this state a negro slave for life, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Baltimore county, to provide a suitable apartment in some of the public buildings belonging to said county and city for the accomodation of the Trustees of the Poor of said county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the children of John Murray, late of Baltimore county, deceased, and to confirm certain proceedings therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following bills.

A bill entitled, an act to make valid certain deeds therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a new road in Frederick and Carroll counties,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Bowie and Goldsborough.
