

many superintendents, deputy keepers, guards and other officers, as they may deem necessary for the service of the institution; and shall also regulate and determine their respective salaries and duties, as far as may not be inconsistent with the laws of the State, or the rules and regulations hereinafter established.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, that the warden shall receive a salary of fifteen hundred dollars, and be allowed the occupancy of such parts of the front building as a dwelling, as are not now used for the purposes of the Penitentiary, and all necessary out houses, yards and grounds not within the walls of the prison proper. And neither the Warden or the Directors or any other person shall have the use of any convict servants in his or their families or otherwise, or enjoy any emolument or perquisite other than the salaries and compensation expressly provided or authorised in this act.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, that the said Warden shall annually appoint an assistant warden, who shall receive an annual salary of seven hundred dollars, and perform the duties provided by law or by the rules and regulations hereinafter established.

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, that the agents of the Maryland Penitentiary shall each receive a per diem allowance of two dollars, for every day that they may attend at the prison in the discharge of their duties, but this act is not intended to require their attendance on Sunday; and the directors shall also receive two dollars each, for every day they may attend in the discharge of their duties as directors, or in the capacity of Monthly Committee, as hereinafter provided; but when they attend in both capacities on the same day, they shall not receive more than one day's pay. And no director shall receive more than fifty dollars in any one year.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, that the book-keeper shall keep a record of the attendance of said agents and directors, as directors and as members of the Monthly Committee, and they shall be paid for their services according to the entries in said record.

Sec. 9. And be it enacted, That the Directors, Warden, Assistant Warden, Agent, and all other officers of the said penitentiary, shall perform and discharge all and singular the duties that may be assigned them respectively by this or any subsequent act of assembly, or by the rules and regulations of the Board of Directors, hereafter to be adopted, and not inconsistent with the provisions of law, or the rules and regulations hereinafter established; and if any of them omit or refuse to discharge any duty appertaining to his office, after having accepted said appointment, he or she shall be dismissed from office, and be subject to a fine of not less than thirty dollars, and not more than five hundred dollars, to be recovered, at the instance of the Board of Directors, in the name of the State, for the use of the said penitentiary, before any justice of the peace or court having jurisdiction thereof, as small debts are now collected.

Sec. 10. And be it enacted, That the said Agents, Warden, Book
