

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Tidball, Jones and Brown, to report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a Bank and incorporate a company, under the name of the Washington County Bank, at the Town of Williamsport, in Washington county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 133.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.

MONDAY, January 29, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Julia Anne Gordy of Worcester county, from her husband William Quinton Gordy, passed by the Senate on Saturday, was sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the citizens of Taneytown, in Carroll county, passed December session 1836, chapter 309, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one the acts to incorporate the American Life Insurance and Trust Company, and the several supplements thereto, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read:

Sec. 4, after the word "capital," in third line, insert "and the same sum on every hundred dollars of any future increase of such capital."

Sec. 6, 3d line, after the word "note," insert "or certificate of deposit payable to bearer."

Sec. 6, last line, after the word "action," insert "other than promissory notes or bills of exchange previously discounted or purchased and then held by the company or its agents."

Sec. 15, 2d line, strike out "May and November, and insert "January and July."

Sec. 17, last line, after the word "hereby," strike out the words "considered as"
