On motion of Mr. Jones,

Read the third time by special order, passed to and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state and to prescribe their jurisdiction, was read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise John Armstrong of Baltimore county, to hold real estate, passed at December session 1828, chapter 48, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wright from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry Miller of Queen Annes county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolutions heretofore offered by Mr. Jones, relative to the currency of the United States, were being read the second aime, when On motion of Mr. Jones,

They were amended as follows:

Strike out the 4th resolution, and insert:

Resolved, That in the opinion of this Legislature, the reduction of the value of the Gold coin as compared with Silver, by the act of Congress opened a field for speculation in the importation of foreign Gold for re-coinage, which being seconded by the unwise efforts of the General Government, in causing the various sums paid to it by foreign countries for indemnities due to its citizens, to be imported in Gold, contrary to the laws of trade, and the true interest of those citizens, were the means of unsettling the basis of the circulation of England, and of bringing about a curtailment of the facilities usually granted to the American trade by the Bank of England, and thereby produced the great depreciation of the value of the produce of this country which ensued, and the commercial embarrassments consequent upon that depreciation.

At the end of the 8th resolution, add the words "to a most injurious degree."

The resolutions were then read through, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Tidball presented the proceedings of a meeting of sundry citizens of Washington county, held in Williamsport, relative to the location of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road.
