

be appended to their return to the Levy court, to act impartially and without favor, fear, affection or prejudice.

Sec. 9, And be it enacted, That the commissioners appointed by this act, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised and required to value the damages, if any, and report the amount of said damages, together with the terms and amount of the contract for building the bridge, to the Levy court of Somerset county, who are hereby required to levy the said amount of damages on the assessable property of Somerset county, for the use of the owners of the land.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act for the protection and preservation of the rights and property of married women,

Which was read the first time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution requiring the public printers to give bond,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Ricaud, Hambleton and Jones.

Also, delivered a bill entitled, an act to impose a tax on Theatrical exhibitions, Circuses, travelling Menageries and public Shows of every description,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Brown, an insolvent debtor, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session 1836, chapter 279, to lay off Worcester county into School Districts, and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, a supplement to an act to authorise the repairing of the court house of Baltimore county, and for other purposes, passed December session 1834, chapter 151,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Jones, Cottman and Bowie.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which said bill was referred, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The resolutions relative to the currency of the United States, were read the third time and assented to.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, ten o'clock.
