

cash deposited, together with all investments of the public monies for revenue, and debts due from individuals and corporations, which would constitute effective means to a greater extent than are possessed by all the banking corporations within the State, and with a view to reduce the amount of such joint stock capital, some one or more of such companies might be purchased with State securities, and merged in the public institutions.
