Mr. Bruce from the committee to which was referred the petition of John McHenry, reported a bill entitled, an act authorising John McHenry of Allegany county, to erect gates on certain public roads, passing through his lands in said county,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time,

and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to confer certain powers over a lot of ground therein mentioned, upon James H. McCulloh of the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the petition of Thomas D. Singleton, reported a bill entitled, an act to direct the court of Talbot county, to authorise the sale of the real estate of Sophia Goldsborough, deceased,

Which was read the first time.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock
