

TUESDAY, February 6, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of Saturday and yesterday were read.

Mr. Brown presented the petition of Josiah Marsh and others, relating to the opening of a road in Baltimore county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Tidball and Hambleton.

Mr. Brown presented the petition of John Lammott of Carroll county, for a law authorising him to complete certain collections,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Lee and Tidball.

Mr. Brown presented the petition of Henry Shreevs of Carroll county, for the passage of an act authorising him to complete his collections, and for other purposes,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Lee and Tidball.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to improve the police of Frederick, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the 6th line of the 4th section, strike out the words "as he shall direct."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Tidball, Brown and Lee, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to a supplement, passed December session 1834, chapter 167, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections, passed at December session 1832, chapter 275.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to prohibit the transportation of absconding slaves, to Hayti or elsewhere, passed at December session 1824, chapter 85,

Which was read the first time.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to limit the time for which Tobacco Inspectors shall continue to hold their offices, passed December session 1836, chapter 122,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Lee, Tidball and Brown.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Caroline county Silk Company,
