Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress be and they are hereby requested to call the attention of their respective Houses to this subject, and to use their best exertions to secure the erection of said "foundry" at Havre de Grace, in this State.

Resolved, That the Governor be, and he is hereby requested to forward a copy of the foregoing preamble and resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The said preamble and resolutions were read the third time, by special order, and the question put,

"Will the Senate assent thereto?"

The yeas and nays were asked for, and on taking them they appeared as follows:

So it was determined in the affirmative, and the preamble and resolutions sent to the House of Delegates.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled a supplement to an act for the appointment of Lime Inspectors for the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 269, and to regulate the inspection of charcoal,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Hambleton.

A bill entitled an additional supplement to an act authorising Henry Shafer, George Shafer and Henry J. Shafer to distribute their estate by lot, passed at December session, 1834, chapter 104,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Tidball, Goldsborough and Jones.

A bill entitled an act to alter and change the division line between the fourth and fifth election districts of Allegany county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bruce, Tidball and Hambleton.

A bill entitled a supplement to an act to incorporate the citizens of Taney Town, in Carroll county,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

A bill entitled an act for the relief of William Rampley, of Harford county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Bruce.
