Gantt, for the branch of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, at Easton, James Price, William Hughlett and Thomas Hayward, for the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann, and for the Hagerstown Bank, David G. Yost and Alexander Neill, Senr. are duly and severally elected Directors on the part of the State, in the said several Banke, for and during the present year.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, February 9, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.
