

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Law Buildings Company of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were read, and

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Ordered to lie on the table—and were as follows:

6th section 2d line, strike out after the word "from" the word "such;" and in the same line and section, strike out these words, "as similar property belonging to any other corporation or individual is subject to."

7th section, add at the end thereof the following:—"or to exercise any privilege whatever, not expressly granted by this act."

Add, at the end of the bill as an additional section, the following:

"Section 8, And be it enacted, that, to the Legislature, is hereby reserved the right, at any and all times, freely to investigate the affairs of said company, and after the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, to repeal or modify the charter thereof."

Also, returned the bill, which originated in the senate, entitled, an act to divorce Julia Anne Gordy of Worcester county, from her husband William Quinton Gordy, endorsed "will pass."

Also returned the preamble and resolutions which originated in the Senate, relative to the establishment of a National foundry, endorsed "assented to."

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Order of United Brothers of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, passed as proposed to be amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the citizens of Taneytown in Carroll county, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Ramply of Harford county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

In the 4th line of the 1st section, after the word "have" insert the word "been."

In the same line, after the word "expended," insert the words "by him."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
