The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The title of said bill was amended, by striking out all thereof after the word "entitled," and inserting "an act to reduce into one the several acts of the General Assembly in relation to the inspection of lime in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes."

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Law Buildings Company of Baltimore, together with the amendments proposed thereto by the house of delegates, were taken up for consideration,

The said amendments were then read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The committee to which was referred the hill entitled, an act to incorporate the Hereford academy in Baltimore county, were discharged from the further consideration thereof.

Mr. Brown then submitted the following message; which was read

and adopted, and with the bill sent to the house of delegates:

By the Senate,

February 13, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message asking the return of the bill, passed by your honorable body, entitled, an act to incorporate the Hereford academy in Baltimore county, and in compliance therewith return the same.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce John McMillan of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Mary Anne McMillan, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bruce from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make valid the election of Jonathan Rinehart, as county commissioner for the tenth election district of Allegany county, reported that they had had the same under consideration, and were of

opinion:-

That, inasmuch as the Executive of the State is vested by law with the power to fill all vacancies which may or shall occur in the board of commissioners for said county, under circumstances similar to those that occurred in the case mentioned in the bill under consideration, it is inexpedient to legislate upon the subject, and recommend that the said bill be rejected.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third

time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county, to
