The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The

proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Beckett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the condemnation of a lot of ground for a public landing in St. Mary's county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones submitted the following order,

Which was read, and On motion of Mr. Jones, Ordered to lie on the table.

Ordered, That the following additional rules be established for the government of the Senate:

Rule When acting on Executive business, the Senate shall be

cleared of all persons except the clerks.

Rule A distinct and separate journal shall be prepared and kept by the clerk, of the Executive Proceedings of the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Bruce,

The bill entitled, an act to make valid the election of Jonathan Rinehart, as a county commissioner for the tenth election district of Allegany county, was reconsidered, and

The question put, "Shall the bill pass?"

It was determined in the negative, and the bill returned to the house

of delegates.

Mr. Kent from the committee on the militia, to which was referred the resolution directing the armorer at Annapolis to contract for the making of two hundred pistol cartridge boxes and two hundred pair of holsters, and for the payment of the same, and

The resolution in favor of James Ninde, reported favorably thereon. They were severally read the second and by special order the third

time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent from the committee on the militia, to which was referred the resolution requesting the Executive to have delivered certain arms for the use of captain Benjamin Sutton, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to be assented to with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the 7th line after the word "security" insert, "to be approved by the Adjutant General."

The resolution was then read the second and by special order the

third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Samuel Painter, of Baltimore county, from his wife Elizabeth Painter, reported favorably thereon.
