named Fanny 26 years of age or thereabouts 5 feet 4 3/4 inches  
high pock broken in the face is the Identical negro  
Woman set free by Eliza Harrison by a deed of manum-  
ission bearing date the 27<sup>th</sup> day of April 1803. which  
is duly enrolled on the Land records of the County afo<sup>r</sup>  
and the said negro Woman named Fanny was born  
and raised in Dorchester County, in the State afo<sup>r</sup>.

mark on the inside of her left thumb, was born  
free (and raised in the County afo<sup>r</sup> - In Testimony

high, has two scars on the back of her  
right hand is the identical person named  
(and set free by a certain James Benson of
