

State of Maryland Talbot County to wit: I hereby certify all persons whom it doth or may concern, that William Smith of the County and State aforesaid came and proved to my satisfaction that the bearer hereof a Black man named Isaac who is now about 21 years of age, 5 feet $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch high, has one small scar on the third finger of his left hand, & one other small scar near his right temple, is the identical person named in a manumission from the said William Smith to the said negro Isaac the said negro Isaac to be free on the 1st day of June 1811 which said manumission was duly acknowledged & recorded in the County aforesaid where the said negro Isaac was raised. State of Maryland Talbot County to wit: I hereby certify all persons whom it doth or may concern, that Samuel Smith of Talbot County came and proved to my satisfaction that the bearer hereof a Black woman an upward of thirty years of age five feet eight to nine inches high has a mark a large scar on her right arm below her elbow was given her and raised in the County of Dorchester by the name of Peter a Danting Smith killed 9 Oct 1741 P.M.
