 I hereby certify that John M. G. Emory Esq. came and proved to my satisfaction that the bearer here of a black Man, who calls himself Major Blayland, and who is now about twenty seven years of age. Five feet eight inches and three quarters of an inch high - of a dark Mulatto complexion, a very large scar immediately under his right breast, is the identical person named in a manumission made by Chas. Emory to Sunday Negro to bearer of the first day of January, Eighteen hundred and ten. which said manumission is duly executed and recorded among the land records of Talbot County (Md.) when the said Major Blayland was raised.

Maryland, Talbot County Court: Hereby certify that John Kemp of the County of Talbot, came and proved to my satisfaction that the bearer here of a colored Man, who calls himself Sumner Caldwell, and who is now about twenty three years of age, five feet nine inches high, one small scar on his forehead in adhesion with his left eye, and of a dark yellow complexion was born free, and that the said Sumner Caldwell was raised with the County of Talbot of Maryland. In Testimony whereof this 29<sup>th</sup> day of July 1811 - Lockwood
