


State of Maryland, Talbot County Court:

I hereby certify, that Mr. William Meloy of the County and State aforesaid came and proved to my satisfaction that the Bear hereof, a mulatto Woman who calls herself Looy Braces and who is now about 25 years of age & feet $7\frac{1}{8}$ " of an inch high a small scar on her forehead, & scar also on her left arm occasioned by the inoculation of the small pox, was born free, & raised in the County State aforesaid.

State of Maryland, I hereby certify, that Mr. Dick of Talbot County Court: & the County and State aforesaid proved to my satisfaction that the bear hereof a black man who calls himself Lou Kingon, who is now about 29 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high a scar on large scar on the upper part of his right breast, one on the forehead on the right side of his head, was born free & raised in the County aforesaid.

State of Maryland, I hereby certify that Mr. James Talbot County Court: & Mr. Daniel of the County and State aforesaid came and proved to my satisfaction that the bear hereof a dark mulatto woman named Martha Kersy who is now about forty years of age five feet five inches and three quarters of an inch high has no remarkable scar, is the identical negro woman, mentioned in a manumission from a certain George Kersy to Sunday negroes dated the 25 day of June 1811 which was duly & legally attested acknowledged and Enrolled amongst the land records of the County aforesaid. The said Martha to be free from the date of the said Manumission
