and shall not from time to time and at all times hereafter acquit and save harmless
as well the Justices of the County aforesaid and their successors for the like being also the
Inhabitants of the said County and from all costs charges troubles and Inconveniences
whatsoever for or by Reason of the birth maintenance nourishing and bringing
up of the said Child and of and from all others suites charges troubles and demands
whatsoever touching or concerning of the same &c. Likewise the said Margaret
Leal is ordered to give security for the payment of the severall Officers their fees due by means
of the premises aforesaid Whereupon the said John Webb and Margt. Leal both present here
in Court acknowledged themselves Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in One thousand
pounds of tobacco to be Levied of their bodys goods or chattels lands or tenements to the
use of the severall Officers that hath a right to any fee or fees due on the Indenture
aforesaid If it happen that the said Margaret Leal do not pay unto the severall Officers
their just fees on the Indenture aforesaid and further the said Margaret Leal acknowledges
herself Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in five pounds Sterling to
be Levied of her goods and chattels lands and tenements to the use of his said Lordship
his heirs and Successors If it happen that she do not make her personal appearance before
the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek in the
same County the third Tuesday of November then next following and do not then and there
give such evidence as she judgeth against John Woolford in relation to the Child aforesaid
to depart the same Court without leave aforesaid
