Whereupon the said Richard Nichols with John Richardson of Somerset County planter his Seninity both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves - I, indebted unto him Lord Proprietor in the sum of forty pounds Sterling each good and Lawfull money of England of their severall goods and Chattells Lands and tenements to the use of the Owners of Somerset County Court and their Successors to be made and levied If it happen that the said Richard Nichols his heirs Executors and Administrators or any of them do and shall not from time to time and at all times here after acquit and save himself as well the Inhabitants of the County aforesaid and their successors for the time being as also the Inhabitants of the said County of and from all past Charges troubles and Incumbrances whatsoever for or by reason of the birth maintenance nourishing and bringing up the aforesaid Ladie begott on the body of the aforesaid Elizabeth Blugsworth and of and from all other suits charges troubles and demands whatsoever touching or concerning of the same her - Likewise the said Richard Nichols is ordered to give security for payment of the severale Officers fees due on the Judgment aforesaid. Whereupon the said Richard Nichols with John Richardson his Seninity both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted in One thousand pounds of tobacco to be levied on me. In case the said Richard Nichols do not pay unto the severale Officers their just fees on the Judgment aforesaid

Memorandum at a session of the peace of his Lordship the Right Cornelius and Charles Honourable Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the province of Maryland hold at Dividing Creek in Somerset County on the third Tuesday of November last the day of the same month anno Domini one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety six before Robert King Gentleman and others his associates Justices of the said Lord Proprietary the peace in the same County to conserve and also divers felonies trespasses and other malfeasances in the same County committed to hear and determine asigned by the oath of William Jones and twelve others being presented that certain Cornelius Dudson and Charles Dickenson for assaulting of a certain Joseph Morell constable and his assistance in his Office ale of Covenbury parish at the house of the aforesaid Cornelius Dudson on the upon which it was commanded the Sheriff of Somerset
