Adm^{ors}. or assigns to the which payment well and truly to be made and done we bind ourselves our and either of our heirs Ex^{ors}. and Adm^{ors}. for the whole and in the whole jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 17 Day of August. Anno Domⁱⁿⁱ 1737

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the Com^{missary} Gen^l hath transmitted unto this Court the Account ^{of the E. life of} James Taylor dec^d. where in it is found that there is due to the above said ^{James} the sum of Sixty three pounds thirteen shillings and two pence current money of Maryland if therefore the above said John Beavins his heirs Ex^{ors}. and Adm^{ors}. or either of them do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto ^{the} orphans the sum of Sixty three pounds thirteen shillings and Two pence current money of Maryland to be paid them according to act of Assembly and dec^d. will when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same. Then the above obligation to be void and of none effect other wise to remain in full force and virtue.
