John Mitchell. That now is for the body of Somerset County as upon their oaths present that John
Mitchell late of Stepney parish in the County aforesaid planter the tenth day of August
in the year of our Lord God seventeen hundred thirty and six with force and arms at the parish
aforesaid within the jurisdiction of this Court one hogg of the value of one hundred pounds of tobacco
of the goods and chattels of Matthew Parrimore then and there being found then and there felonie
ously did steal take and bare away contrary to the peace of the said Lord Proprietary
that now is his good Rule and Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such
Case lately made and provided &c

Test: Matthew Parrimore William Jones Thomas Caldwell Elizabeth Daw - on the foregoing
bill of Indictment it was endorsed vizt: A true Bill William Jones foreman

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that should take the said
John Mitchell if he to answer &c and afterward to will the fifteenth day of March and
Dom^o One thousand seven hundred and forty six before the Justices of his Lordships County Court
of Somerset now here held in the Court house at Doding Creek in the same County beneath the aforesaid John
Mitchell according to a certain recognizance by him and his Surety by them in that part first made
in his proper person under custody of Joseph M^r Foster Gent^s Sheriff into whose custody
before that time for that cause aforesaid was committed to him and being instantly
asked how he of the felony in the Indictment aforesaid above upon him imposed would
be acquitted says that he in no sort is guilty thereof and thereof of good & evil purpose
upon the contrary Therefore I immediately caused this of the Jury before the Justices of his Lord-
ships County Court of Somerset now here held in the Court house at Doding Creek in the same County
this instant fifteenth day of March by which he and who he to recognize &c because aforesaid he and
the same day is given to the aforesaid John Mitchell under custody of the Sheriff and the Jurors of that
