And Whereas upon the said William Hook and Comfort by Geo Dougles their attorney complain that whereas the said William Whittington on the tenth day of November Anno Domini seventeen hundred and twenty seven at Somerset County afo<sup>r</sup> within the Jurisdiction of this Court was indebted to the said George Taylor in his life time in the sum of three pounds fourteen shillings Court money of Maryland for one Cow and Calf and one Barren Cow by the said George in his lifetime to the said William Whittington at the especiall request and instance of the said Whittington before that time sold and delivered and being so thereof indebted afterwards vyzt the day and year afo<sup>r</sup> at the County afo<sup>r</sup> upon himself did assume and to the said George in his lifetime then and there faithfully promise that he the said Whittington the said three pounds fourteen shillings Court money of Maryland when he should be afterwards thereto required to the said George he would faithfully pay and settent and Whereas the afo<sup>r</sup> Whittington afterwards vyzt the day and year afo<sup>r</sup> at the County afo<sup>r</sup> was indebted to the said George in his life in other three pounds fourteen shillings Court money of Maryland for the like sum of three pounds fourteen shillings Court money of Maryland by the afo<sup>r</sup> William Whittington of the said George in his life had and received and being so thereof indebted on consideration thereof afterwards to wit the day and year afo<sup>r</sup> at the County afo<sup>r</sup> upon himself did assume and to the said George in his life time then and there faithfully promise that he the said William Whittington the said last mentioned three pounds fourteen shillings Court money of Maryland when he should afterwards be thereto required he would faithfully pay and settent and whereas the said William Whittington afterwards to wit on the day and year afo<sup>r</sup> at the County afo<sup>r</sup> did buy and receive of the George Taylor in his lifetime one other Cow and Calf and one Barren Cow he the said
