William Whittington on Consideration thereof afterwards to wit the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid upon himself did assume and to the said George in his life time then and there faithfully promise that he the said William Whittington when he should be afterwards thereto required well and faithfully would pay to the said George as much money as the said last mentioned Edward Caffard the said last named barren Law were reasonably worth and the aforesaid William Hook and Comfort say that the said last named Edward Caffard barren Law were reasonably worth the sum of three pounds fourteen shillings current money of Maryland of which the said Whittington by the said George in his life time afterwards to wit to wit the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid had notice Nevertheless the said William Whittington his severall promises and assumptions aforesaid in form aforesaid nothing regarding but mind us and fraudulently intending the said George in his life time and the aforesaid William Hook and Comfort since the death of the said George craftily and subtilly to deceive and defraud the said severall sums abovesaid or any part thereof to the said George in his life to the said William Hook and Comfort since the death of the said George hath not paid or paid her or them or either of them for the same in any sort Contented but that to doe hitherto hath altogether refused and still doth refuse altho' thereto by the said George afterwards to wit the day and year aforesaid and often since that time required and also by the said Comfort after the death of the said George while she was sole and before espousals between her and the said William Hook celebrated to wit on the first day of May Anno Domini MDCCXXXIII at the County aforesaid and often afterwards required and altho' also by the said William Hook and Comfort after their Inter marriage to wit on the fifteenth day of June Anno Domini MDCCXXXIV at the County aforesaid and often since that time the said William was thereto required Whereupon the said William and Comfort say they are damaged ten pounds current money of Maryland and thereof they bring suit &c. And the said William Hook and Comfort his wife brings into Court here the testamentary letters of the said George in due form of Law to the said Comfort while she was sole granted which testify the said Comfort to be Executrix of the Testament and last will of the said George and thereof to have administration -
