William Whittington on Consideration whereof afterwards to wit the day
and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid upon himself did assume and to the said George
in his lifetime then and there faithfully promise that he the said William
Whittington when he should be afterward thereto required well and faithfully
would pay to the said George as much money as the said last mentioned Coward Calf and
the said last named banner now were reasonably worth and the aforesaid William
Hooke and Confort say that the said last named Coward Calf and banner now
were reasonably worth the sum of three pounds fourteen shillings and money
of Maryland of which the said Whittington by the said George in his life time after-
wards to wit to the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid had notice Nevertheles
the said William Whittington his several promises and assumptions aforesaid in form
of nothing regarding but in mind and fraudulently intending the said George in
his lifetime and the aforesaid William Hooke and Confort since the death of the said George
hastily and subtilly to deceive and defraud the said several sums above named
or any part thereof to the said George in his life time to the said William Hooke
and Confort since the death of the said George hath not paid or given her or them
or either of them for the same in any sort Conforted but that to doe hitherto hath
altogether refused and still doth refuse altho' thereto by the said George afterwards to
wit the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid often since that time required and
also by the said Confort after the death of the said George while she was sole and before
espousals between her and the said William Hooke celebrated to wit on the first
day of May anno Domini MDCCXXXIII at the County aforesaid and often afterwards
required and altho' also by the said William Hooke and Confort after their Interven-
age to wit on the fifteenth day of June anno Domini MDCCXXXIV at the County
aforesaid often since that time the said William was thereto required Whereupon
the said William and Confort say they are damaged ten pounds current money of
Maryland and thereof they bring suit &c And the said William Hooke and Confort his
wife brings unto Court here the testamentary letters of the said George in due form of
Law to the said Confort while she was sole granted which testify the said Confort
to be Executrix of the Testament and last will of the said George and thereof to have
Administration -
