said Lord proprietary now he says that he is in no sort thereof guilty and of this he puts
himself upon the Country Geo Douglas - And as to the Residue of the trespass afo above supposed
to be done the afo John says that the afo Thomas his accon afo thereof against him to have and
maintain ought not because he says that the said Thomas the day and year afo in the declaration
afo above specified at Somerset County afo with force and arms in and upon the said John an
assault did make and him the said John then and there would have beaten wounded and evilly
Intreated unless the afo John himself against the said Thomas then and there had defended and
so the said John says that the hurt or Injury if any to the said Thomas then and there happened
was of the proper assault of the said Thomas Adams and in the defence of the said John Deal
and this he is ready to verify &c. Whereupon he prays Judgment if the said Thomas his accon afo
against him to have and maintain ought -

Whereupon the afo John Deal prays
that the afo Thomas Adams to the pleas afo of him the same John may reply - Upon which
which it is said to the same Thomas Adams by the Court here that he reply to the pleas
afo of the same John but the same Thomas altho' solemnly called cometh not nor to
the pleas of the afo John replyeth nor is his writt afo against ^{the afo John} further prosecuted -

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the afo Thomas Adams take
nothing by his writt and declaration afo but that he and his pledges of prosecuting to wit
John Deal and Richard Roe be in mercy and that the afo John Deal go thereof without
Day &c. and further it is considered that the afo John Deal Recover against the afo Tho
Adams Three hundred and Twenty Six pounds of Tobacco for his lost &
Charges by him about his defence afo in that part sustained to the same John Deal
by the Court here according to the form of the Statute in such Case then lately made and
and provided as judged and that the same John have thereof Provision &c.
