Thereupon a certain Robert Jenekins Henry of Somerset County Gentleman present here in Court
in his proper person undertakes for the said James Rownd according to act of assembly that in case
the said John Fuller do at any time within a year & day appear and make all or any part of the said
James Rownd's claim against him appear to be satisfied or other wise to be undue before the laying
of this attachment that then the said James Rownd shall make restitution unto him the said John Fuller
of all or such part thereof as shall be so made appear to be undue or that he the said Robert
Jenekins Henry will do it for him the --
