

and seven at Somerset County afo within the Jurisdiction of this Court did make his certain  
 note in writing called a promissory note with his proper hand subscribed bearing date the  
 same day and year last mentioned and the note afo to the said Martin Fenton then and there  
 delivered by which said note the same Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey did oblige himself his heirs or  
 executors to pay or cause to be paid to the said Martin Fenton the full and just sum of  
 ten pounds paper money for value received and by reason thereof as also by virtue of the  
 statute in that case lately made and provided the same Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey became  
 chargeable to pay to the said Martin Fenton the said ten pounds according to the tenor  
 of the said note and so there with chargeable being the afo Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey afterwards  
 (to wit) the afo second day of August in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hund  
 red thirty and seven afo within the Jurisdiction afo upon himself did a foraine and to  
 the same Martin Fenton then and there did faithfully promise to pay the sum of money  
 afo according to the tenor of the said note Never the less the said Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey  
 his promise and assumption afo in form afo made nothing regarding but plotting  
 and fraudulently intending the said Martin Fenton in that part craftily and subtilly  
 to deceive and defraud the afo ten pounds to the same Martin Fenton he hath in no sort  
 paid or satisfied altho the same to do the said Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey by the said Martin  
 Fenton (to wit) on the eighteenth day of August in the year last above mentioned and  
 often afterwards at Somerset County afo he was thereunto requested but the same to  
 the said Martin Fenton to pay or him for the same in any sort to Content and satisfie  
 hath refused and still doth refuse Whereupon the said Martin Fenton saith he is  
 the worse and damage to the value of twenty pounds Curr<sup>t</sup> money of Maryland and  
 thereupon he brings suit &c. Dedges J. J. Doe & P. Roe

All which day here before the Justices of his Lordship County Court of Somerset at Devi  
 ding Creek James the afo Martin Fenton by his attorney afo and the sherriffe to wit  
 John Henry Gent at the same day here returned that he had taken the afo Wonney  
 M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey whose body hereat this day he had ready to answer unto the afo Martin  
 Fenton of the plea as to him it was Comanded, and the same sherriffe further  
 returned that he had served the same Wonney M<sup>ce</sup> Lemmey with a copy of the declara  
 tion afo according to the act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.  
Whereupon
