All which day here before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of  
Somerset before al deviding cause came the afo<sup>d</sup> James Mumford by his  
attorney afo<sup>d</sup> and the sherriff to wit John Henry gent at the same day here-  
returned that he had taken the afo<sup>d</sup> John Small whose body hereat this day he-  
had ready to answer unto the afo<sup>d</sup> James Mumford the afo<sup>d</sup> plega as to him it was  
commanded ~~that~~ And whereupon the afo<sup>d</sup> John Small in his proper person comes  
and defends the force and injury wherein and saith that he cannot gainsay the action  
of the afo<sup>d</sup> James Mumford nor but that he did assume upon himself in manner  
and form as the afo<sup>d</sup> James Mumford above against <sup>him</sup> hath complained and as to the damage  
of the same James by him by reason of the premises in that part sustained the same  
John saith and acknowledgeth that the afo<sup>d</sup> James little sustained damages by reason  
of the premises beyond his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part apposed to  
four pounds seven Shillings and Six pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of Maryland and not more &  
because the afo<sup>d</sup> James dares not this but the same allegation ~~be~~ to be true  
pray Judgment for those damages above acknowledged together with his costs and charges afo<sup>d</sup>  
to him to be adjudged &c.

Therefore by consent of the parties afo<sup>d</sup> it is considered  
that the afo<sup>d</sup> James Mumford recover against the afo<sup>d</sup> John Small his damages afo<sup>d</sup> to the  
afo<sup>d</sup> four pounds Seven Shillings and Six pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of Maryland in sum afo<sup>d</sup> acknow-  
ledged as also Two hundred Eighty and Nine pounds of tobacco for his  
Costs and Charges afo<sup>d</sup> to the James Mumford at his request by the Court now here of the afo<sup>d</sup> of  
the parties afo<sup>d</sup> adjudged which certain damages in the whole do amount to four pounds -  
Seven Shillings and Six pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of Maryland and Two hundred Eighty and Nine  
pounds of tobacco and the afo<sup>d</sup> John Small in Money ~~be~~ paid <sup>paid</sup> ~~paid~~  
should be paid immediately after return of the writ Whereupon came herein to Court a certain John <sup>and</sup> Morgan
