Harper prosecuted an Action on the case against your petitioner alledging  
that your petitioner has prosecuted against the same Edward Harper an Indictment for an assault  
and Battery to the great damage of the same Edward as was therein alledged on the trial whereof  
the same Edward recovered a verdict and Judgment against your petitioner for nine hundred  
pounds of tobacco or some other sum of tobacco within the cognizance of this Court for damages by  
Occasion of the same premises your petitioner further sheweth that he is advised the verdict  
and Judgement a<sup>e</sup> are contrary to the Rules of equity and good conscience your petitioner therefore  
humbly pray your worship will proceed to enquire into the same as a Court of equity and that  
Subp<sup>na</sup> may issue against the said Edward Harper to answer the premises a<sup>e</sup> and that your  
worship will make such order and decree therein as shall be agreeable to equity and good conscience  
and he will pray it

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he shuld cause  
to come the said Edward Harper if he be answerable and afterward to witt the Eighteenth day of March  
anno Dom<sup>i</sup> One thousand and thirty five before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset  
now here hold at Dwidg Beck in the same County Cuse the said Edward Harper by George Douglass his  
attorney and praye leave hereof to Imparte herewith the third Tuesday of March anno Dom<sup>i</sup>.
