Dividing Creek the <sup>of</sup> John Henry by George Douglas his attorney and the Coroners  
(to wit) William Lane and Henry Ballard Gents at the same day here returned that they had  
taken the <sup>of</sup> John Cowell whose body here at this day they had ready to answer the <sup>of</sup> John  
Henry of the <sup>of</sup> plea as to him it was commanded &c. afterwards to wit the same third Tuesday  
of November ann. Dom. One thousand seven hundred and thirty seven at Dividing  
Creek Cometh the <sup>of</sup> John Cowell in his proper person and the <sup>of</sup> John Henry then and  
there his writ of against the <sup>of</sup> John Cowell did not prosecute with effect but voluntari-  
ly suffered his suit to be discontinued -- Therefore it is considered that the <sup>of</sup>  
John Henry take nothing by his writ of <sup>of</sup> but be in mercy for his false clamour and  
that the <sup>of</sup> John Cowell go thereof without day &c.
