of the same Justice and do not answer unto his said Lordship of the Inditment above said do  
not stand and abide the Judgment of the Court thereon, and that she be in the mean time of  
the good behavior &c. At which day here before his said Lordship Justice came againe  
as well the said William Goldborough Gent who for his said Lordship in that part followeth as  
the said Mary Masfeline in her proper person according to the Recognizance of by her and  
her Security of acknowledged and Wherupon the said Mary Relinquisheth her Verification  
of by her above pretended saith that she cannot deny but that she is guilty of the trespass  
and assault of in the Inditment of specified above upon her imposed in manner and form
