Joshua Caldwell } held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday
of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven before
his said Lordship's Justices the peace in the same County to keep assigned
by the oath of twelve Jurors being presented that Joshua Caldwell late of
Coventry parish in the County aforesaid Gentleman the twenty second day of
March in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred thirty and
seven at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this
Court in and upon Joseph Enolds Gent^l in the peace of God and the said
Lord Proprietary then and there being by force and arms and assault did
mole and hurt the said Joseph Enolds then and there did beat wound and
evilly treat so that of his life it was greatly despaired and other harms
to him then and there did to the grievous damage of him the said Joseph
Enolds and against the peace of the said Lord Proprietary that now is his
good rule and Government :

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should
take the said Joshua Caldwell if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should
safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justice of his Lordship's County
County Court of Somerset now sitting at Dividing Creek to answer unto his said Lordship
