His Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the
Province of Maryland commanded his Justices and Clerk of the County
of Somerset by his writ to them thereof directed in these words following

Maryland Sir Charles absolute Lord and proprie of the provinces of Maryland and
avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c To the Justices and Clerk of Somerset County
greeting we being willing for certain causes to be certifed of the Record and proceedings
of a certain action before you depending between Peter Taylor Junr and John Evans
of a plea of trespass upon the case We command you that the Record and proceedings
in the action aforesaid with all things thereto relating as far as before you it remains
by whatsoever name the parties in the same are distinguished to our Justices of our
Provincial Court to be held at Annapolis the third Tuesday of May next under your
hands and seals you send together with this writ that our said Justices may further do
therin that which of right they see ought to be done witness Lewis Hale Esq; Chief
Justice of our provincial Court the 28th day of October in the 23^d year of our Dom:

Which same writ and the Record and Proceedings in the same Writ mentioned
with all that happened before us we send in these words following - Command was
given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take John Evans late of Somerset
County plenter if he should be found in his baileywick and him should safe keep so that he
might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be
held at Deviding Green in the same County the third Tuesday of June Anno D: 1737
thousand seven hundred and thirty seven to answer unto Peter Taylor of a plea of trespass
upon the case aforesaid. All which day here ~~was~~ before his Lordships Justices at Court
then held at Deviding Green in the County aforesaid came the aforesaid Peter Taylor by ^{as} ^{though his attorney}
John Evans and the Sheriff to wit Joseph McClester Gent: nowhere returned that he had
labored the aforesaid John Evans whose body hereat this day he had ready to answer the aforesaid Peter
Taylor of the aforesaid plea and him it was commanded. And hereupon the
said John Evans puts in his place Robert Jenkins Henry Gent: attorney at Law against
the aforesaid Peter Taylor in the aforesaid plea -- Whereupon at the request of
