At William Jones - Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County

 that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court

 of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven to
 answer unto William Jones of Apolea that he render unto him eight pounds
 two shillings and six pences curr^t money of Maryland which to him he oweth
 and unjustly detaineth £. and the same day is given to the aforesaid William
 Jones £. At which day here before his Lordships Justices at a Court then held
 at Deviding Creek in the same County came the aforesaid William Jones by Robert
 Penchins Henry his attorney and the aforesaid Sheriff to wit John Henry gent^r now
 here returned that he had taken the aforesaid Thomas Fletcher whose body he had
 this day he had ready to answer the aforesaid William Jones of the aforesaid sum it was
 commanded.
