

fletcher prays further Leave thereof to Imparle here untill the next Court to be held at deviding Creeke in and for the County afo^e the third Tuesday of March then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the afo^e William here also &c. At which day here came againe as well the afo^e William Jones as the afo^e Thomas Fletcher by their attorneys afo^e And Whereupon the said Thomas Fletcher by his said attorneys saith that he cannot deny the action afo^e of the afo^e William Jones nor but that the bill or writing afo^e is the deed of the same Thomas nor but that he oweth the same William the afo^e eight pounds two shillings and six pence in manner and form as the afo^e William above against him declared &c.

Therefore it is Considered that the afo^e William Jones recover against the afo^e Thomas Fletcher his debt afo^e and his damages by occasion of the detaining the same debt to:

243 pounds of tobacco to the same William of his afo^e by the Court here ad judged and the afo^e Thomas in mercy &c.

Command was given to the Sheriffe of Somerset County that he should take William Jackson late of Somerset County planter and Tabitha his wife if they should be found in his bailliwick and then should safe

keep so that he might have their bodies before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at deviding Creeke in the same County the third Tuesday of November Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven to answer unto Edmond Bayly and Thomas Evans of a plea that they render unto them nine hundred sixty and six pounds of tobacco or eight hundred and sixteen pounds of tobacco and fifteen shillings Curr^t money of Virginia of the value of thirty shillings Curr^t money of maryland which to them they owe and unjustly detain &c. and the same day is given to the afo^e Edmond Bayly and Thomas Evans here &c. At which day here before his Lordships Justices at a Court then held at deviding Creeke in the same County came the afo^e Edmond Bayly and Thomas Evans by Geo: Douglas their attorney and the afo^e Sheriffe to witte
