this that after the twenty ninth day of September which was in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred seventy and one to witt the aforesaid nineteenth day of January aforesaid in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred thirty and seven aforesaid in Somerset County aforesaid four or five small stiches of Brasiletto wood twenty six wooden small bowls three small looking glasses one course sifter ten new england buckets six wooden spice mortars a small tub of gun powder twenty seven wooden platters four small gimblets five half bushel measure seventeen Iron Skillets cast ware thirteen peices of earthen ware one old pewter tanchard one old funnel one old flying gib sail one old axe one barrel of Molasses three hundred fifty and seven pounds of pork in one open hoghead and one pair of small Shillards were laden and taken on board the said vessell or boat without any bond being given that the said Brasiletto dyng wood should be carried to great Brittain or some other of his Majesties ^{brittish} plantations contrary to the form of the Statute in that behalf lately made and provided Whereupon the said Edward Chambers Esq. as well for the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary as for himselfe prays the Advice of the Court herein the premises and that the said vessell or boat together with her tackle apparell and furniture and the said four stiches of Brasiletto dyng wood, twenty six wooden small Bowls, three small Looking Glasses, one course sifter, ten new England Buckets, six wooden Spice Mortars, one small Tubb of Gun powder, twenty seven wooden platters, four small Gimblets, five half Bushel measure, seventeen Iron Skillets cast ware thirteen peices of earthen ware one old pewter Tanchard one old funnel one old flying gib: sail one old axe one Barrel of Molasses three hundred fifty and seven pounds of pork in one open hoghead and one pair of small Shillards remain forfeited to the use of the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary and the said Edward Chambers Esq. and that the said Edward Chambers Esq. may have one third part ^{of the value} thereof according to the form of the Statute aforesaid. Whereupon proclamation was made for the Lord the King (as the manner is) if any person would Inform the Court here why the said vessell or boat with her tackle apparell or furniture, four stiches of Brasiletto dyng wood, twenty six wooden small Bowls, three small Looking Glasses, one course sifter, ten new England Buckets, six wooden Spice Mortars, one small tubb of Gun powder, twenty seven wooden platters, four small Gimblets, five half Bushel measure, seventeen Iron Skillets cast ware, thirteen peices of earthen ware one old pewter Tanchard one old funnel one old flying gib sail
