 Propy and the said Edward Chambers Esq<sup>r</sup> for the cause afo<sup>r</sup> should not remain forfeited, that  
 he should come forth and be heard, and none so to do appearing It is agreed that John  
 Henry Gent<sup>l</sup> Sheriff of Somerset County be commanded by writt of the Lord Propy that now  
 in under the seal of this Court the said Vessel or Boat with her tackle apparell or furniture  
 four Slits of Brasillato dying wood twenty Six wooden Small Bowls, three Small Looking  
 Glaps One Course Sifter ten New England Buckets Six wooden Spue Morters One Small  
 Table of Gun powder twenty seven <sup>of</sup> Platters four Small Gimblatts five half Bushell Measures  
 Seventeen Iron Skillets Cast ware, thirteene pieces of Earthen Ware, One Old pewther tankard  
 One old funnel One flying gib Sail One Old or, One Barrel of Mollapos, three hundred fifty  
 and seven pounds of pork in one Open hogghead and one pair of Small Skillets by the oath  
 of honest and Law full men of the said County Justly and faithfully to cause to be appraised  
 making thereof Indentures between him and the said appraisers, etc. so that one part of the said  
 Indenture he have laid Immediate before his Lordship <sup>of Justice</sup> sitting in Court now holden at Durindny  
 Creek. And afterwards in the same Court the said Sheriff return here the writt afo<sup>r</sup> together

 according to a writt to the said Sheriff of the said County of Somerset directed and hereunto annexed  
 have upon oath viewed and appraised the severall goods and things hereafter mentioned  
 as followeth viz<sup>t</sup> One Vessel or Boat called the White Haven at the value of One pound Curr<sup>t</sup>.  
 money of the province of Maryland four Small Slits Brasillato dying wood at the value of three  
 shillings and one penny half penny, twenty Six wooden Small Bowls at the value of six shill<sup>l</sup>  
 and eight pence three Small Looking Glaps at the value of three shillings, One Course Sifter  
 at the value of six pence, ten New England Buckets at the value of eight shillings and four pence  
 Six wooden Spue Morters at the value of eighteen pence one Small table of Gun powder
