Injury wherein he and prayeth Leave here of to Imparle here until the third Tuesday of August then
next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Ann Draper here also. —

At which day here came againe as well the aforesaid Ann Draper as the aforesaid Henry Windsor by their attorney
aforesaid and whereupon the same Henry prayeth further Leave here of to Imparle here until the third
Tuesday of November then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid Ann Draper
here after. —

At which day here came againe as well the aforesaid Ann Draper as the aforesaid Henry Windsor by
their attorney aforesaid and whereupon the same Henry Windsor as before defendeth the same & Injury wherein
he and saith that he did not agree upon ^{himselfe} to the said Alexander in his Lifetime in manner of sum as
the said Ann above against him hath complained and of this he putteth himselfe upon the Country and the
said Ann in like manner. —

Therefore it is Commanded the Sheriff of the County aforesaid that he
should cause to come here the third Tuesday of March then next following twelve ^{do} by whom & and who

which the aforesaid Ann Draper altho solemnly called Court not nor further prosecuted her writt & Declaration
aforesaid against the aforesaid Henry Windsor. —

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid Ann Draper & partie of the same Alexander Draper
and her pledges of prosecuting to wit John Doe & Richard Roe be in mercy and that the aforesaid Henry
Windsor goe free without day fee. —
