And the said Henry Windsor by Francis Allen his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force  
of the said Judgment and prayeth Leave there of to Impark here until the third Tuesday of August then  
next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Ann Draper here also.

At which day here came againe as well the said Ann Draper as the said Henry Windsor by their attorney  
aforesaid and whereupon the same Henry prayeth further Leave there of to Impark here until the third  
Tuesday of November then next following and he hath it and the same day is given to the said Ann Draper  
here also.

At which day here came againe as well the said Ann Draper as the said Henry Windsor by  
their attorney aforesaid and whereupon the same Henry Windsor as before defendeth the force and injury where-  
of he - and saith that he did not assume upon <sup>himselfe</sup> the said Alexander in his Life time in manner of form as  
the said Ann above against him hath complained and of this he puts himselfe upon the Country and the  
said Ann in like manner.

Therefore it is Comanded the Sheriff of the County of Kent that he  
should cause to come here the third Tuesday of March then next following to wit the twelfth by whom he and who  
neither he because as well he and the same day is given to the parties aforesaid. At which day  
here came againe as well the said Ann Draper as the said Henry Windsor by their attorney aforesaid  
and the Jurors of that Jury then of Ingham called being called Libewia came to wit Nicholas Fountain  
Joshua Stinger Charles Townsend Joseph Houston Robert Mitchell Richard Chamber William Mum-  
ford Moss Driskile John Williams John Shiles John Bedden James Jones who to say the truth of the  
premises of being duly elected Tryed and sworn, and after that the same Jurors of their Verdict there of  
to say by the Court were charged and from the Bar of this Court of their Verdict of and upon the premi-  
ses to render did goe back between themselves to commune, and there of amongst them selves being  
fully agreed and afterwards to the same Bar for their Verdict in that part to render returned upon  
which the said Ann Draper altho solemnly called Cometh not nor further presented her writ of Declaration  
aforesaid against the said Henry Windsor.

Therefore it is Considered that the aforesaid Ann Draper Cometh of the same Alexander Draper  
and her pledges of Prosecuting to wit John Doe and Richard Roe be in mercy and that the said Henry  
Windsor goe thereof without day he.
