matter in dispute between them arisen by means of an attachment purchased out of this Court by the aforesaid John Williams and a Condemnation thereupon had in the same Court of the goods and Chattle of the said Martin Fenton in the hands of him the said John Williams a certain Geo: Douglas and Robert Jenckins Henry of the County of Kent and if they the said Arbitrators cannot agree in the premises, that then they the said Arbitrators to make choice of a third person and their award in the premises aforesaid between the parties aforesaid to be returned to his Lordships Justices at Winding Creek the third Tuesday of August then next following that the same Justices may proceed thereon to Judgment &c. and the same day is given to the parties aforesaid there &c.

All which day here came again as well the aforesaid John Williams as the aforesaid Martin Fenton in their proper persons, and the aforesaid Arbitrators said not their award in the premises aforesaid therefore further day is given to the arbitrators here until the third Tuesday of November then next following for the making & returning of their award in the premises aforesaid and the same day is given to the aforesaid parties there &c.

All which day here came again as well the aforesaid John Williams as the aforesaid Martin Fenton in their proper persons, and the aforesaid Arbitrators said not their award in the premises aforesaid therefore further day is given to the arbitrators here until the third Tuesday of March then next following for the making and returning of their award in the premises aforesaid and the same day is given to the parties aforesaid there &c.

All which day here came as well the aforesaid John Williams as the aforesaid Martin Fenton in their proper persons and the aforesaid Geo: Douglas and Robert Jenckins Henry arbitrators aforesaid here at Winding Creek their award in the premises aforesaid in form following &c.

Whereas John Williams and Martin Fenton by Rule of Somerset County Court made in June last (According to the form of the Statute in that Case provided) did submit a certain matter in the said Court depending between them by means of his Lordships Writ of attachment levied at the suit of the said John Williams on the goods and Chattle of the said Martin Fenton and was having pursuant to such submission taken upon us the determination of the premises do award that the said Martin Fenton do pay to the said John Williams the sum of eight pounds current money of the province of Maryland in the whole gold or silver on or before the twentieth day of this present.
