Likewise the said William King with the said Joseph King and Womney Maulmney his securitys all present heren Court in their proper persons as aforesaid acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in forty pounds Curr. Money of Maryland of their goods and Chattels Lands and tenements Joyntly and severally to the Use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to be made and Levied. If it happen that the said William King do not keep good rule and orders and do suffer Idle Lovers or disorderly persons to tippel game or commit disorder or other irregularities in his Ordinary or house of Entertainment during the time that he shall keep the same Contrary that to the true Intent and meaning of the act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.
